Fourteen Local Community Organizations to Receive Funding from Community Benefits Plan

July 11, 2023

Windsor, Ontario • The Gordie Howe International Bridge team announced today that 14 organizations will receive \$200,000 (CDN) in funding through the Community Benefits Plan.

The funding is part of the Community Organization Investment initiative, which offers grants up to \$25,000 (CDN) to organizations serving Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit. Seven organizations from Windsor and seven from Detroit were selected following an application process, marking the fourth annual funding release of this five-year initiative.

This year's recipients will deliver the funded projects between July 2023 and June 2024.

This year's available funding increased from \$100,000 (CDN) to \$200,000 (CDN), based on a demonstrated need for additional funds in the initiative's previous three years. To date, through this initiative, \$500,000 (CDN) has been invested in events, programming and infrastructure improvements. All funding recipients and their initiatives align with priorities identified during public consultation including community partnerships, community safety and connections, aesthetics and landscaping and economic benefits.

QUICK FACTS

- Funding through the Community Organization Investment initiative is available each year between 2020 to 2024 and is one of over 35 initiatives that make up the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy component of the Gordie Howe International Bridge Community Benefits Plan.
- The application process for this year's initiative ran from November 2022 through January 2023 and
 resulted in 36 eligible submissions. The project's Local Community Group, comprised of stakeholders
 from the host communities, played a significant role in reviewing the applications and providing
 recommendations to the project team.
- As part of this initiative, community organizations can apply annually for funding for events, programming and infrastructure improvements in amounts ranging from \$1,000 - \$25,000 (CDN). The application process for the 2024 funding cycle is anticipated to open in November 2023.
- The Gordie Howe International Bridge Community Benefits Plan is being delivered by Bridging North America with collaboration and oversight from WDBA and the State of Michigan.
