Community Benefits Plan Progress

NEIGHBOURHOOD INFRASTRUCTURE STRATEGY

COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION INVESTMENT



The Community Organization Investment (COI) initiative is an annual \$100,000 (CDN) investment for organizations located in Sandwich/west Windsor and Deiray/Southwest Detroit. Funding is used to support events, programming and/or infrastructure improvements.

The application period for the 2023 COI funding cycle will open later this fail. Further details, including eligibility requirements and the application form will be available on the project website at the end of November.

2021 COI PROJECT UPDATES

In June, First Latin American Baptist Church hosted the grand opening of their Victory Activity Center, an indoor recreation facility in Southwest Detroit. Partial funding helped to complete the building that will host organized athletic activities and other youth programming.

In August, the Windsor Police Community Services Branch, in partnership with New Beginnings, hosted the DiverCity Barbecue at Mic Mas Park in Sandwich. The community enjoyed a day of interactive games, cultural performances, informational booths, and a complementary BBQ.

A new accessible ramp was built to connect the rear parking lot of the John McGivney Children's Centre to the sidewalk leading to the accessible playground. The new 'Bridge to Play McGivney' is anticipated to be well-used by staff and kids in the John McGivney School Authority, as well as members of the Sandwich community.

The new Victory Activity Center in Southwest Detroit provides an indoor recreation facility for basketball, indoor soccer, volleyball, aerobics and a food pantry

This land has also served as a place of refuge for the Huron/Wendat people.


Coming together: Gordie Howe International Bridge Tower Transition Area Completed


Build a Dream: Career Discovery Expo
