Ribbon Cutting at Malden Observation Area

The <u>Malden Park Observation Area</u> is now open to visitors. This morning, Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority and the City of Windsor held a ribbon cutting ceremony to mark its <u>grand opening</u>.


The Malden Park Observation Area provides an attractive, safe location, for residents, students and tourists to observe the construction of the Gordie Howe International Bridge. It is located at the highest vantage point in Windsor, Ontario, at Malden Park. Looking northwest, visitors will enjoy a unique view.

The observation area includes a landscaped area, enhanced with railings, benches and wayfinding signage, directing viewers' attention to a clear view of the Gordie Howe International Bridge. The opening of the observation area allows for plenty of time to view the progress and completion of the bridge deck over the Detroit River and the progress of Canadian Port of Entry facilities and landscaping.

A key component of the bridge design, the stay cables of the Gordie Howe International Bridge are a sight to see. To date, over 116 stay cables have been installed out of a total of 216. The team is counting down to the final 100. Stay cables play an integral role in the design of the bridge and support the weight of the structure and involve an intricate installation process. NEIGHBOURHOOD INFRASTRUCTURE STRATEGY COMMUNITY ORGANIZATION INVESTMENT AND INITIATIVE UPDATES

In July 2023, the project team invested \$200,000 (CDN) into 14 projects that will be delivered in Sandwich/west Windsor and Delray/Southwest Detroit, as part of the 2023 Community Organization Investment (COI) initiative. This is the fourth funding release of this five-year initiative. The projects will be delivered between July 2023 and June 2024. Urban Neighborhood Initiatives (UNI) – Creative Placemaking in Southwest Detroit (2022 COI)

UNI developed an empty lot in Springwells to include a native plant garden, a patio and shipping container for an outdoor cooking area and a Gaga Ball pit. Local youth and residents participated in the design and build of the community wellness lot through UNI's Land Stewardship Program.

Art Windsor-Essex (AWE) – Look Again! Outside: Sandwich (2022 COI)

In spring 2023, five artwork reproductions from AWE's collection were installed around Sandwich. Artwork was co-curated by Sandwich resident, Reginald S. Tolson, and selected based on connections to the community's past, present and future. The reproductions will be used in educational programs and materials. AWE hosted a guided art walk in summer 2023 to celebrate the installation of the artwork in the community.

This land has also served as a place of refuge for the Huron/Wendat people.



Gordie Howe International Bridge Project Unveils First Collectable Commemorative Patch to Mark Tower Completion


