Community Benefits Local Community Group Seeking Six New Members

A key feature of the Gordie Howe International Bridge project is the inclusion of a Community Benefits Plan. The robust plan includes \$20 million in neighbourhood improvements plus more than 80 workforce development initiatives to ensure the Windsor-Detroit region benefits from and engages with the project.

Approximately 34,500 Expanded Polystyrene (EPS) blocks are being used across the Gordie Howe International Bridge project. While they will not be visible once work is complete, these geofoam blocks act as a soil replacement to avoid ground settlements that can cause issues for the structures above. 
The team recognizes the importance of accountability and transparency on ESG commitments and will issue quarterly progress reports on these activities.
