

International Bridge opens. Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority and the Trans-Canada Trail recently announced that the bridge will become the first international bridge border crossing within the 28,000 km trail network. The dedicated multi-use path will offer a safe, toll-free way to move between Windsor and Detroit, connecting the Great Lakes Waterfront Trail in Windsor, to the Iron Belle Trail and the Great Lakes Way in Detroit.

To support the multi-use path's operation, the project team seeks feedback from future users through an online survey, focus groups and public meetings. Information gathered will help develop policies relating to hours of operation, public safety, and the overall user experience.

Gordie Howe International Bridge Multi-use Path


