EXCITING TIMES

A lot has happened since our last publication.

July 17, 2018, marked the start of advance construction at the US project sites, including at the bridge piers, on the lands that will become the US Port of Entry and at the Michigan Interchange.

On September 28, 2018, WDBA announced that it had signed a \$5.7 billion, fixedpriced contract with Bridging North America to design, build, finance, operate and maintain the Gordie Howe International Bridge project and that the new bridge will be in service by the end of 2024.

Just one week later, on the morning of October 5, 2018, WDBA and Bridging North America celebrated the official start of construction on the Gordie Howe International Bridge project. Prime Minister Justin Trudeau; Minister of Infrastructure and Communities, François-Philippe Champagne; Michigan Governor Rick Snyder; Canadian Ambassador to the United States, David MacNaughton; Eric Isaac, an Elder from Walpole Island First Nation, joined WDBA and Bridging North America staff and many other supporters at the site of the Canadian Port of Entry for the official ceremony.

Later in the day, hundreds of people gathered for a community celebration at Senator David A. Croll Park, in downtown Windsor. Photos of the events are on page four.

THE GORDIE HOWE INTERNATIONAL BRIDGE

- Road and infrastructure improvements will be made to approximately three km of Sandwich Street from Ojibway Parkway to the Rosedale Avenue roundabout.
- A six-foot protected cycle track will be installed along both sides of Fort Street between Green and Junction Streets.
- The Gordie Howe International Bridge will be white in colour.

- The multi-use path will be located on the east side of the bridge.
- 6 "Green" roofs will be installed on some buildings located within the ports of entry.
- The Canadian Port of Entry
 will include native plantings,
 in particular, the Black Oak
 savannah and tallgrass prairie
 landscapes which are unique to
 the area.
- High-powered LED lighting will illuminate the bridge to achieve a striking and visually pleasing effect at night.
- The bridge towers will have a striking visual appearance with two legs which will rise from the ground and extend upwards, inclining towards each other, until they meet far above the bridge deck.
- The Gordie Howe International Bridge is being designed with a 125-year lifespan.

Q. What other infrastructure projects have you been involved with?

I have over 24 years of experience in project execution, operations, finance and accounting for some of the industry's largest megaprojects both in north America and elsewhere. Most recently, I served as the Chief Financial Officer of the USD \$5.6 billion Maryland P3 Purple Line Transit project which is located just outside of Washington D.C. Prior to that I was the CEO and Executive Director of the Eagle P3 Transit Project in Denver, Colorado.

Q. What do you think will be the most rewarding part of your job?

I believe my day-to-day job will to be focused on building lasting relationships with all stakeholders involved in the project. This project is a once-in-a generation undertaking and one that will leave a lasting legacy, not only on the region, but for our industry as a whole. I'm excited to be part a project that will forever change the landscape of Detroit and Windsor and empower progress for decades to come.

Q. What do you wish other people knew about the project?

I wish people knew how incredibility complex this state-of-art project is going to be. There are four main components, the two ports of entry, the bridge and the Interstate 75 interchange improvements, are each very complex designs and builds. But that only scratches the surface. For example, we have to design and build to meet the infrastructure standards in both Canada and the United States and to deliver an iconic project for the entire region. This will be no small task but I'm confident in the partnership and our ability to deliver this world-class project.
