# **Construction Activites - What you need to know**

#### **US POE**

· Started the backfill of the drainage layer and installation of Wickdrains. Continue with excavation, clearing and grubbing and deliveries of imported materials; sand and drainage layer. DTE continues with removal of cables and cutting poles along South St. Miscellaneous demolition is on-going.

#### **US BRIDGE**

· BNA and their subcontractors recently completed the first stretch of fourteen 2m drilled shafts for the US Seawall modifications. The next phase is to construct new anchor wall elements and transfer the load from the existing anchor wall to the new 2m shafts. This work allows the removal of existing seawall interferences that facilitates installation of the twelve 3m tower foundation drilled shafts to begin.

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## **Traffic updates - Continued**

Bridging North America will permanently implement closures on these roadways on August 22, 2019, at 7 a.m. for the construction of the US Port of Entry (POE) of the Gordie Howe International Bridge.

- · Waterman Street northbound and southbound between South Street and Norfolk Southern Railway
- Rademacher Street northbound and southbound between South Street to Norfolk Southern Railway
- Reid Street northbound and south-bound between South Street to Hesse Street
- Crawford Street northbound and southbound between South Street to Norfolk Southern Railway
- Livernois Avenue southbound be-tween South Street to Norfolk Southern Railway
- · Hesse Street eastbound and west-bound between Rademacher Street to Reid Street
- South Street eastbound and west-bound between Post Street to Dragoon Street

Detour routes have been provided for access around the construction zone.
