### 9 Things To Know

Work is well underway to prepare the US Port of Entry site for construction of the Gordie Howe International Bridge project later this year. Take a look at some of the [US progress highlights](#) achieved to date.

- 1 INVESTMENT**  
\$ 150 million of preparatory activities are underway now to prepare the US Port of Entry.
- 2 PROPERTY ACQUISITION**  
95% of properties required for US project components have been acquired. 80% of required residents and business relocations have been completed.
- 3 DEMOLITION**  
235 buildings have been demolished on properties under MDOT's control.
- 4 ELECTRIC RELOCATIONS**  
Over 25,000 ft (almost 5 miles) of electric cables installed.
- 5 WASTE REMOVAL**  
Over 1,350 cubic yards of debris has been removed from vacant parcels of land.
- 6 CLEARING AND GRUBBING**  
Tree removal activities on lands already acquired for the project has begun. Replacement landscaping equivalent to the total area of 66 football fields will be planted as part of future construction.
- 7 SEWER RELOCATIONS**  
Constructed 8 new sewer crossings on a portion of I-75. Over 1,200 ft of pipes and box culverts have been installed.
- 8 GAS RELOCATIONS**  
Over 6,000 ft (over 1 mile) of gas lines have been installed to meet current and future needs.
- 9 JOB OPPORTUNITIES**  
To date, more than 20+ unique Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBE) have been hired to work on the US project site.

### Safety Reminder

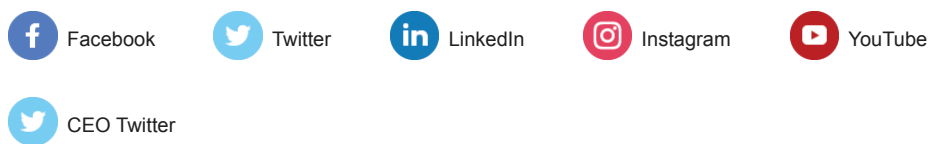
