

Michigan Advance Construction Start

Yesterday, Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority (WDBA) announced that another significant milestone in the Gordie Howe International Bridge project has been reached with the start of Michigan advance construction.

The groundbreaking ceremony, held at the US Port of Entry site, saw delegates from all levels of government and key project representatives celebrating the start of advance work in Michigan, in preparation for full construction to start later this year.

Beginning in July 2018, Bridging North America, the Preferred Proponent selected to deliver the Gordie Howe International Bridge project, will begin advance construction at the US project sites, including at the bridge piers, on the lands that will become the US Port of Entry and at the Michigan Interchange. Bridging North America is able to undertake this work through a separate agreement.

In parallel to this work, Bridging North America and WDBA will continue to work toward finalizing the public-private partnership procurement process to reach Financial Close by the end of September. Once financial close is reached, Bridging North America will officially become WDBA's private-sector partner.
