COMMITTED FUNDING The financing for the Gordie Howe International Bridge is secured as per the Crossing Agreement signed by Canada and Michigan. No Michigan funding is required.

Gordie Howe International Bridge is the result of 1000s hours of consultation with individuals, community groups, businesses, trade unions and other stakeholders in US and Canada.

DIRECT CONNECTIONS Gordie Howe International Bridge is the only border crossing in Windsor-Detroit to have direct connections to both Ontario's highway system and Michigan's 🚲 interstate system.

CONSTRUCTION START Construction of the Gordie Howe International Bridge will begin in fall 2018.
