**Last Call for Local Community Group Applications**

REMINDER: The application period for local representatives interested in participating in the Community Benefits Local Community Group is closing **Wednesday, September 4, 2019**.

WDBA and Bridging North America are launching a Local Community Group to assist in the delivery of the Gordie Howe International Bridge Community Benefits Plan. This group will be composed of stakeholders that collectively represent the communities of Detroit/Delray and Windsor/Sandwich, Windsor-Essex County and the Greater Detroit Area and will act as informal partners during the implementation of the initiatives identified in the Plan.

The Local Community Group will meet quarterly and will provide valuable input and formal linkages to the region that will enable the project team to understand the perspective of project stakeholders regarding the Community Benefits Plan. They will also assist with the review of community funding applications as part of the Community Organization Investment within the Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy and participate on subcommittees focused on topics such as community art or history.

A number of long-term road closures recently came into effect in Southwest Detroit between the Norfolk Southern Railroad tracks (NSRR) and Jefferson Avenue to allow for construction of the US Port of Entry for the Gordie Howe International Bridge project. Streets included Waterman Street, Rademacher Street, Reid Street, Crawford Street and South Street (between Post Street and Dagoon Street).
