ICYMI – WDBA and Gordie Howe International Bridge Win at annual P3 Bulletin Awards

Windsor-Detroit Bridge Authority (WDBA) was recognized as Government Agency of

the Year at the 2019 P3 Awards hosted by P3 Bulletin while the Gordie Howe

International Bridge project also won in the category of Best Road/Bridge/Tunnel Project. The respective honours came amid strong competition from other industry leaders and renowned projects. The P3 Awards, held in New York, is one of the largest events recognizing and rewarding the best in public-private partnerships (P3s).

The Government Agency of the Year award is presented annually to a government

agency that has provided exemplary project leadership in promoting innovative deal structures and timely, efficient delivery of infrastructure projects in Canada, the United States, or Latin America. The award is the first award of its kind received by WDBA that recognizes the organization and the people behind the project.
