Upcoming Traffic Closures in Southwest Detroit


As construction of the Gordie Howe International Bridge project continues, Bridging North America will temporarily implement the following closures:

- Mobile closures on northbound and southbound I-75 Service Drives between Clark Street and Green Street beginning August 14 and continuing to December 22, 2020, between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. as needed. Only one lane will close. Closures will be less than 30 minutes in duration during these timeframes for activities related to mobilization and demobilization of equipment.
- Partial shoulder closures on Springwells Court for construction activities between August 19 and October 30, 2020 between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m. as needed. The shoulder closures will not impede two-way traffic.
 - The southbound Springwells Court right shoulder between the railroad tracks and 300 feet east of the tracks will close between August 19 to September 24, 2020.
 - The southbound Springwells Court right shoulder between the Aggregate Drive entrance and 300 feet north of the entrance will close between September 25 to October 30, 2020.

Tower Footing Concrete Pour

The first concrete pour above ground for the Gordie Howe International Bridge tower foundations on the Canadian bridge site occurred July 1, 2020 This pour included approximately 960 cubic metres or 120 truck loads of concrete taking approximately 24 hours to complete. Tower Cranes

With tower footing work underway on the Canadian and US bridge sites, two tower cranes and two smaller mobile crawler cranes now pierce the skyline along the Detroit River. At their current height, the tower cranes are the equivalent of a 21storey building. Once the cranes reach their final height, they will more than double the height of Windsor's tallest building and will be taller than the 73-story GM Renaissance Centre in Detroit. It took three days each to construct the tower cranes. Watch the time-lapse video and learn more about these massive pieces of construction equipment.
