Pedestrian Bridge Design Selected

Today, the Gordie Howe International Bridge team announced that following several months of consultation with the community, an aesthetic design has been selected for the five pedestrian bridges to be constructed as part of the Michigan Interchange work. The design selected features a curved steel arch and will be constructed of pre-cast concrete. The pedestrian bridges will be located over Interstate 75 (I-75) in Detroit at Solvay Street, Beard Street, Waterman Street, Junction Street and Lansing Street. Bridging North America will undertake construction of these pedestrian bridges between 2020 and 2024. Read more.

The Neighbourhood Infrastructure Strategy of the Community Benefits Plan includes

a commitment to provide a \$50,000 (CAD) annual investment allowance for community organizations located in or servicing Sandwich/West Windsor or Delray/Southwest Detroit. Funding will be made available on an annual basis from 2020-2024.

Eligible organizations can submit funding applications until January 31, 2020, for the
