

called post-tension work. Post tensioning is a technique used to reinforce concrete and other material with high strength steel bars or a bundle of strands known as "tendons." Post-tensioning tendons are high strength steel cables or strands inside plastic ducts or sleeves that significantly help reduce a structure's weight and foundation load by spreading it out. There are 21 tendons in the footings for the Canadian towers and 25 tendons in the footings for the towers in the US. A total of 1,426 steel strands are used to connect the tower footings.
